Ask "why"

Invite your preschooler to explain what's happening in a story and to predict what will happen next. Through these discussions, children practice vocabulary and build comprehension.

Connect

Draw connections between what you read in books and your preschooler's own experience. Real-life connections provide a foundation for new ideas and concepts.

Draw and write

Drawing is an important part of learning to write. Through their sketches and scribbles, preschoolers learn that marks on a page represent words and ideas.

Express yourself

Talk about your favorite books and how much you love to read. Knowing that you think reading is fun and important will boost your preschooler's interest and enjoyment.
